FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

(The answers to these questions do not replace the terms of the Lease Agreement)

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

What are the costs involved in residency?

Our current Lifetime Lease costs for both 2 bedroom and 2 bedroom+study residences, are outlined in the attached Information Sheet.

Is there a recurrent Weekly Service and Maintenance Fee?

Residents are required to pay a weekly service and maintenance fee, based on either double occupancy or single occupancy, this fee is paid on a per calendar month basis. This fee covers council and water rates; cleaning, gardening and maintenance of the common areas within the Village; home building insurance; Live Life Mobile Alarm fees and on-site management. The current fees are outlined in the attached Information Sheet.

Can the Weekly Service and Maintenance Fee be varied in the future?

The fee may be increased in accordance with the Retirement Villages Act 1986 and, in general, this will mean annual increases not more than the Consumer Price Index.

How can I get involved in decisions about the Village's level of service and maintenance?

Residents will be invited to participate in decision-making regarding changes or improvements to general services and maintenance via the Residents Committee.

How much money do I get back after I leave?

When you leave Beolite Village you will receive the balance of your initial lease payment less the accrued Deferred Management Fee (calculated at 5% per annum of your lease payment, capped at 30% after 6 years), reasonable refurbishment costs and any outstanding Weekly Service and Maintenance Fees.

After I leave, how long will it be before I get my money back?

Your entitlement is paid within 14 days of a replacement resident taking occupancy.

After I leave, who receives my entitlement?

The money is paid to the resident or, in the event of death of a single resident, to the nominated beneficiary.

SECURE OCCUPANCY

Is my occupancy secure?

Yes. A lifetime lease provides protection for all residents as per the Retirement Villages Act 1986.

What if my health declines?

Beolite Village is an independent-living village and therefore does not provide aged care or health services. If a higher level of health care is required or for other unforeseen circumstances, occupancy may be ended in accordance with the lease agreement.

What system is available to resolve disputes?


As provided by the Retirement Villages Act 1986, any disputes will be resolved according to the terms of the Dispute Resolution Scheme established by Beolite Village.

What happens if Beolite Village is sold to another organisation?

This is most unlikely, however, irrespective of company ownership, your Lease Agreement and the Retirement Villages Act 1986 protect you and your occupancy.

Set in landscaped gardens, Beolite Village offers two bedroom or two bedroom plus study, energy efficient brick homes designed with an emphasis on easy-living. Homes boast as standard features such as north facing living areas, reverse cycle air-conditioning, private courtyards, double lock-up garages and a 24-hour emergency alarm service. The well-appointed kitchens have bench-height ovens, single drawer dishwashers and plenty of drawers and cupboards.

Additionally, residents have unlimited access to the Scobie & Claire MacKinnon Community Centre featuring full catering kitchen, billiards table, resident's lounge, multipurpose room and covered external deck area overlooking the croquet lawn. Allied Health and hairdressing services are also offered.

Beolite Village Limited is a not-for-profit charitable company established in 2006. We have a charter to build and operate an affordable, high-quality, independent-living retirement village in North-East Victoria for retirees (or those planning retirement) who do not wish to continue living alone or in remote communities.



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VILLAGE LIFE

What lifestyle can I expect?

At Beolite Village you can enjoy a high standard of living in a secure community setting, with easy access to Mansfield for shopping, entertainment, as well as community, health and emergency services.

Are medical, hostel or nursing care available?

No. As Beolite Village is an independent-living village, there are no medical or nursing services provided on-site. However, residents have ready access to Mansfield's exceptional community, health and emergency services which include the Mansfield District Hospital, Visiting Nursing Service, Victorian Rural Ambulance Service and, of course, meals-on-wheels.

Is there an emergency call system?

Yes. All residents will be provided with a 24-hour safety alarm system via Live Life Mobile Personal Alarm. This service allows our residents to feel safe whether they are at home or out and about.

What space is available for car parking, caravans and boats?

All homes have double garages, and residents and their visitors can also park on their driveways. Beolite has a separate area for parking of boats, trailers and caravans.

PLANNING FOR RESIDENCY

Is there a waiting list for Beolite Village?

Prospective residents can secure a position on the waiting list by lodging a fully refundable \$1,000 deposit. Upon signing of contracts, a 10% refundable deposit is required and will be lodged in an interest-bearing solicitor's trust account.

Will I have a say in the design, construction and furnishing of my home?

If your home is not yet built, options may be available for minor modifications to your house design, together with your preferred colour scheme from the three options available. Of course, your furnishings are your own choice.

Can I bring my family pet?

Pets are welcomed at Beolite Village, however, they are expected to be under control at all times and not disturb other residents. There is also an off leash enclosed dog run area provided.

Can my family come and stay with me?

Yes family and friends are welcome to come and visit you at any time.


